



Cross Border Community Eye Health Care Program Free The Oppressed Report 2021 November

The community eye care program, Free The Oppressed—the eye mission in Karen state continues work along Thailand and Burma border. Due to the border do not close as before we can across the border and organize eye mission activity. Our team can only organize the eye care program in Karen state and target only people inside Burma and people who live close to us from Thai side can receive eye care as well. By the helped from Thai hospital, NGO and Karen Health Organization we had completed Covid-19 vaccination mission. The eye activity will continue their work as they could and will never stop. Because our patient keeps coming from a very long way to receive for eyes care since we have opened eye clinic. Our eye missions only can run at (K7 Pa An District – KNLA HQ Thay Bay Tar clinic and K6 Lay Tar U Tar clinic for this moment, and will visit other clinic for next year.

After we discussed with Oo Pa hospital about providing a vaccination for the community who live along the border at Burma side, the hospital agreed to provide Covid-19 vaccine for all the residents. Because most of the people who live around the border mostly will go to Oo Pa hospital for treatment, but the hospital require Covid-19 vaccine certificate to able to provide them the care. More than, 2000 peoples received fully vaccinated before the end of 21 December 2021.
