

Cross Border Community Eye Care Program Free The Oppressed Report - October to December -2022

The community eye care program, Free The Oppressed– by continually providing eye screening and treatment in the Karen state. along Thai and Burma border. The Karen people who live inside Kawthoolei who live along Thailand Myanmar border ,and other ethnicities who live in Burma essentially require eye treatment. It Should be noted that health challenges are significantly higher in rural areas where approximately 70 % of the population lives. Health status data analysis indicates significant disparities between regions and groups in access to and quality of , health services , particularly affecting ethnic minorities ,poor people, and people living in remote areas. For this reason, our eye care team carried out a mission to provide eye surgery to a thousand patients per year. For the past to years, the negative impact of Covid-19 restricted people to receive primary eye care consequently it increasing the total number of people with eye conditions, additionally, the negative impact of the coup in Burma also inhibits people to access health care services as well. (fighting in Burma.) any time we organized the eye mission, we received a lot of patients coming from different regions to assess the treatment. although the fighting is happening near their area and the journey is not safe However with the hope they try to come till arriving at our plan. We compare the last years and this year more patient coming

Our goal for this training is to recruit eye care professional later so they can help with health promotion and health prevention and raise awareness in the community. p On the 3 to 9 October 2022 this year we organized primary eye care training for the community health worker at the bridge (6) region kawthoolei and there were 21 trainees at the end of training, we give then the primary eye care certificate which can guarantee their completion of the training.

We provide treatment for 6 day and total we screened 327 patients and 153 went through operation.

(9) - On 1 November 2022 we carried out a mission at two places include E Thu Tar clinic we call internally displaces person camp, 5 day. Some patient can come long way and difficult travel with truck and motorcycle, but patient tried to come for treatment.













(10) – On 7 November 2022 we go to another eye mission to Dee Pu Noe and open the clinic in Tar U Wah camp. we has a lot patient came for treatment Even though they are afraid of Airplane bombing and the fear surrounding them. On 12 November mix night the airplane bombing in Dee Pu Noe village close Tar U Wah camp after that but the patient tried to come to our clinic. We open the clinic two week in Tar U Wah camp.
