

Cross Border Community Eye Care Program Free the Oppressed Report – March to April 30, 2023

Community eye care program, Free the Oppressed aims to plan, procure, transport, and deliver the public health components related to the eyes and vision: vision screening, dispensing of spectacles, eye drops and collaborate to bring cataract and other eye surgery to the people of Burma. Since 2013, our program has started, we screened and provided care over 100 thousands patients and performed eye surgeries over 10 thousands. In imply this, our program continually exercised in many areas in response to the need of People in Burma and will constantly provide eye care in the future.

From The Last Week Of March to April 30, 2023, we planned for three missions which is:

- 1. Lay Tar Au Tar Clinic, Yaw Ker Daw sub-district, Brigade 6, Kaw Thoo Lei
- 2. U Mi Hta, Bu Tho Township, Mutraw District, Kaw Thoo Lei
- 3. Maw Per Ko, Hpa-An district, Brigade 7, Kaw Thoo Lei

Lay Tar Au Tar Clinic is located at Yaw Ker Daw sub-district, Brigade 6, Kaw Thoo Lei. The hospital established in 2020 to respond the need of the community. We planned the mission from March 28 to April 3, 2023. Due to the fighting conflict and air strike, many of the patient were afraid to come to get the treatment. For this mission we screened 157 patients and 63 patients needed for the eye operation and provide Glass 56 People



After the next morning of the surgery, we would open the patient eye for the first time. As usual, we will pray to God and ask for the miracle to all our patient. For this time, Pastor David Eubank prayed for us and asked for the blessing to God.



Poe Dah is our eye surgeon assistant for 8 years. Currently, she can block the facial nerve before the operation. Our eye program is always motivating and pushing all our staffs to be a hard-working person and updated person. In the future, we have a plan to the young generation who is capable and qualify to take over the role and carry on the mission.

U Mi Hta Emergency and Health Care Center is one of the hospitals located beside Salaween river, Bu Tho Township, Mutraw District, Kaw Thoo Lei. It was established in 2021. Last year, we had to cancel our plan because of the environment hazard. After the renovation, we planned for the mission again from April 10 to 15, 2023. As planned, we successfully achieved our plan for the second time.

Due to the uncertain circumstance of civil war and difficulty of transportation, many of the patient were afraid to come to see us. However, during 5 days of our mission, we screened 107 patients and 46 patients needed for the eye operation and provide glass 61 People.







Saw Wah Gay is 7-year-old boys, who has cataract to both eyes. He could see when he was a child till, he turned 2-year-old his vision got blur and gradually he could not see anymore. He and his father came far from his village to receive the treatment. After eye screening, he was diagnosis as both eye cataract. Normally for the child we need to provide them anesthesia but Saw Wah Gay didn't receive that kind of treatment. However, he was brave and could tolerate to the pain. Fortunately, we successfully done the operation. After the last day of the vision test, his vision was improved from seeing the angle of light to 6 meter of count figure.



Maw Per Ko village is located beside Thoo Mwee Klo, Lwe Bwe township, Hpa-An district, Kaw Thoo Lei. We started our mission from April 18 to 24, 2023. During our mission, we screened 403 patients and 143 patients needed for the eye operation and provide glass 161 people. Some patients were from far area like Brigade 1, 2 and 5 to receive the treatment from our team.

We would like to thanks the leaders, teacher and the villager for welcoming us to their place and providing us all the resource to be able to run the mission efficiently. We also have a future plan to run the mission there again because their place is convenience for patient to come and transportation is accessible.
